

## Funding for the Future

## **PowerSchool Perform**



This document outlines how a sustainable investment in PowerSchool's Perform solution can be achieved using long-standing federal funds, COVID emergency relief funds, and unique state grants.

Funding Source	Alignment to PowerSchool Perform
ESSER	ESSER funds are used to meet district needs arising from the COVID-19 pandemic, including ensuring continuity of operations, accelerating learning, and supporting student mental health.  A flexible, digital tool for providing performance feedback and designing
	professional growth plans is a crucial component of maintaining district operations during shifts to remote and hybrid learning and for supporting staff in meeting student learning recovery needs.
Title I Part A	The core purposes of Title I Part A are to ensure that all students meet challenging state academic standards and to close achievement gaps.
	To the degree that high-quality performance feedback and professional growth planning around instruction enables staff who support eligible students to accelerate academic achievement, PowerSchool Perform may be proportionally funded with Title I.
Title II Part A	The intent of Title II Part A is to promote the effectiveness of educators in improving student academic achievement, including through high-quality systems for performance evaluation. As such, an investment in PowerSchool Perform can be made using Title II funds.
Title IV Part A	Title IV Part A is purposed to promote safe and healthy schools, to provide increased access to well-rounded educational opportunities, and to promote the effective use of technology in teaching and learning. Additionally, a limited amount of funds can be used to improve technology infrastructure.
	To the extent that high-quality performance feedback and professional growth planning increase staff capacity to promote safe and healthy schools, to provide well-rounded educational opportunities, and to effectively leverage technology in their instruction, PowerSchool Perform may be proportionally funded with Title IV.

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Funding Source	Alignment to PowerSchool Perform
Title V Part B	Title V funds, or "REAP" funds, are made available to rural districts to supplement their other federal grants. These funds may be used towards any of the allowable uses of other Title funds, including providing high-quality performance feedback to staff.
Unique State Grants	Many states make competitive grants available to school districts to aid in addressing high-priority needs. Grants for promoting academic achievement, improving conditions for learning, and retaining and developing staff can all be leveraged towards an investment in PowerSchool Perform.
General Fund	Districts may choose to leverage their general fund towards digital systems that improve student outcomes, reduce demands on staff, and yield cost savings.
